

Examples of Entry Level Jobs in Emergency Preparedness

Emergency Preparedness Planner

- Develop and or revise key response documents as part of the DSHS Emergency Operations Plan.
- Collaborate with internal and external partners to ensure DSHS disaster roles and responsibilities are accurately reflected in their plans.
- Provide technical assistance to partners on public health and medical disaster planning.

Program Specialist II - Community and Social Services

- Create, enhance, and support the local and regional capacity for emergency response.
- Ensure communication and compliance with community partners within the emergency response plans to improve community outcomes.

Disaster Finance Specialist

- Respond to state emergencies and disasters by developing budgets, writing financial reports, and identifying eligibility for purchases related to emergency preparedness.
- Review current programs to recommend improvements for operations and training.

Training and Exercise Coordinator

- Coordinate public health preparedness training and exercise activities.
- Assess training needs to create and facilitate training plans and exercises.

Interested in next steps? Consider becoming certified with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), National Incident Management System (NIMS), and the Incident Command System (ICS).



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
