



Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease (CJD) Resources

National Prion Disease Pathology Surveillance Center (Case Western Reserve University)

- Identify precise type of prion disease (sporadic, familial, or acquired) by examining histopathology, the prion protein type, and the prion protein gene
- Monitor incidence of prion disease in the United States and for novel prion diseases
- Coordinate free brain-only autopsies through their national autopsy network and perform neuropathologic examination of brain tissue
- Analyze CSF (14-3-3 protein, t-Tau protein, and RT-QuIC), blood (genetic testing for familial CJD), and brain biopsy and autopsy tissue for suspected CJD cases
- RT-QuIC (real-time quaking-induced conversion): detects the abnormal prion protein
- Brain MRI interpretation service
